Aloha 'Āina – “Mai Poina: Don't Forget”

On January 17, 1893, in the face of an overthrow staged primarily by the U.S. sugar businessmen assisted by the United States Marines, Queen Lili'uokalani conditionally yielded her authority to the U.S. in order to avoid the bloodshed of her people. This walking tour presented by the Hawai'i Pono'i Coalition presented in 2009 re-enacts four critical days leading up to the Queen's overthrow.
