


ACT III. THE RETURN OF THE PRINCE.

LEILANI: I love to bask in the sunshine of Hawaii; I love its green mountains crowned with snow-like clouds, its gentle zephyrs laden with the fragrance of flowers, the sea with its soft green waters, the rainbows in its valleys, its flowers of variegated hues and fragrant vines nowhere else to be found; palm trees that stand like sentinels on ~~the~~ shore, waving "aloha" to the stranger and bidding him to land; ~~gorgeous~~ sunsets, rare and fascinating moonlight nights -- all add to the peculiar charm of this, my seagirt home. (Orchestra plays introduction to her song). Yes, Hawaii, thou art paradise to me; land of unequalled hospitality and love -- romantic love -- the love that inspires me to sing. (She sings "LEILANI'S CALL" followed by echo from chorus back of stage; Leilani joining last two notes; she goes to the pool to drink water in the native style).



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(At conclusion, KEAHE rushes in, pauses suddenly, and enthusiastically exclaims:)

KEAHE: Oh, Leilani! How fascinatingly beautiful and charming you are today!

LEILANI: (coquettishly) Do you ~~really~~ think so, Keahe?

KEAHE: My eyes do not deceive me, I am certain. (Excitedly): Leilani, the village folk are all excited over the return of the Prince of Hawaii tomorrow and great preparations are under way ~~to properly receive his royal highness.~~

LEILANI: I am indeed very happy to learn that he is returning. At times ~~I have entertained the notion that he may become discontented with the home of his youth and may desire to seek his fortune elsewhere. (She hesitates and looks away).~~ It is certainly comforting and most encouraging to know that he ~~is coming back to -- er -- to -- er~~ (runs over and clasps Keahe by the hands). Keahe, do you know the prince was here last week?

KEAHE: (astonished) Here last week?

LEILANI: Yes, here! (slowly) He was very lonesome for someone so he had to come to see her.

KEAHE: Who? I cannot imagine who it could be! (Orchestra plays introduction and the stanza of "PUA ROSELANI" softly).

LEILANI: (figeting) If these trees could only speak they would say, "LEILANI".

KEAHE: (Kneels, kisses her hand; rises) Um! Leilani, truly thou art blessed of the gods! (Orchestra plays a little louder; Keahe places a lei on her, puts a flower in her hair, and exclaims:) Oh, to be loved by a prince! Auwe!! ~~Orchestra~~  
(later) I am so excited, Leilani! (later) You will be dedicating a song to him, I know. (Voices back stage laughing; girls enter from both sides, followed by boys; they form and sing the chorus of "PUA ROSELANI", Leilani singing the obbligato on the repeat.

(Leilani and companions sing introduction back of the wings coming on stage in time to start song; companions pair off, take fancy waltz steps across and back; chorus sings harmonious chord accompaniment, swaying back and forth; girls on swings in action. At conclusion of solo, LEILANI dances, chorus sings the song; after song, she takes place on log at right and remains more or less by herself).

KAOHU: So happy to see you today! (whispers) Are you aware of the fact that the Prince is to be here today?

LEILANI: The Prince here? (Hesitates and appears perplexed) Oh, that would be lovely! (Spruces up, ~~ways down~~, ~~turning KUNANE~~). What is the program, Kunane? (Keone steps to the back to gaze down the path).

KUNANE: The princesses of the islands are to be crowned today and we have been busy as bees making the leis for the important ceremony. (~~Bells sing, and applaud~~).

Keone. Here comes the Prince! Three cheers for the Prince of Hawaii! Hulo, hulo, hulo! (Crowd sings "We Hail the Prince, after which he enters with students, the orchestra playing the "Students' March". The prince takes notice of Leilani sitting by herself on a log at the side. The prince and students march to front of the stage and sing "Kamehameha Waltz.")
