# Piano I, II, III, IV

1 credit / Semester, daily

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Prerequisites: Preceding level or teacher approval

## General course description and justification:

Piano I is an entry-level course designed to develop music reading skills as well as proper piano playing technique. Students will also be taught basic music theory.

Piano II is a continuation of Piano I. Students will further develop their music reading and piano performance skills as well as their understanding of music theory. Students in Piano II are required to perform a solo recital piece at the end of the semester.

## **Student Learning Outcomes:**

Students will be able to:

- 1. Learn to rehearse efficiently.
- 2. Play songs on the piano by reading music.
- 3. Identity time and key signatures, note names, scales, intervals and chords.
- 4. Identify musical symbols for expression and navigation.

## Grading:

Grading will be determined on a point basis. Points will be awarded for the following categories:

Students are expected to:

## Attendance, participation, and work make-up policy:

All students should be in their seats before the appropriate time. Any student who enters the classroom after the appropriate time will be considered tardy. The assignment score will be reduced by 5 points per day after the deadline.
