1 credit / Year, odd days

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Prerequisites: none

General course description and justification:

Chorus I is an entry level music course. Students will learn proper singing technique, multi part singing, basic music theory and sight reading. Students in this course will develop performance and recording skills and will be given opportunities to perform in public.

Chorus II and Select Chorus are a continuation of Chorus I. Students will continue to learn proper singing technique, multi part singing, music theory and sight reading. Students will further develop their performance and recording skills and will be given opportunities to perform in public.

Student Learning Outcomes:

Students will:

- 1. Learn to rehearse efficiently.
- 2. Learn to comprehend instructions through reading, listening and watching.
- 3. Write answers in complete sentences.
- 4. Be able to sing ones part correctly using proper breathing and vocal technique.
- 5. Be able to read music at a functional level.
- 6. Participate in at least one performance per semester. This year's mandatory performances are our Christmas Concert scheduled on Thursday, Dec 12, 2013 and our Spring Concert scheduled on Thursday, April 10, 2014.
- 7. Participate in the Nā Mele o Maui Song Competition including after school rehearsals.

Grading:

Grading will be determined on a point basis. Points will be awarded for the following categories:

1.	Daily participation:	5 points
2.	Class work/homework	10-20 points
3.	Quizes:	10-25 points
4.	Written exams:	50-100 points
5.	Performances:	50-100 points
6.	Extra credit:	1-5 points

Grades will be awarded according to the percentage of points earned of the total points possible. Percentages will not be rounded up to the nearest whole number (89.9 is a B+).

Attendance, participation, and work make-up policy:
