Once upon a time, there was a dolphin named David. He woke up to a beautiful day. He lived in a peaceful home with his mom, dad, sister, and brother, until one day.....



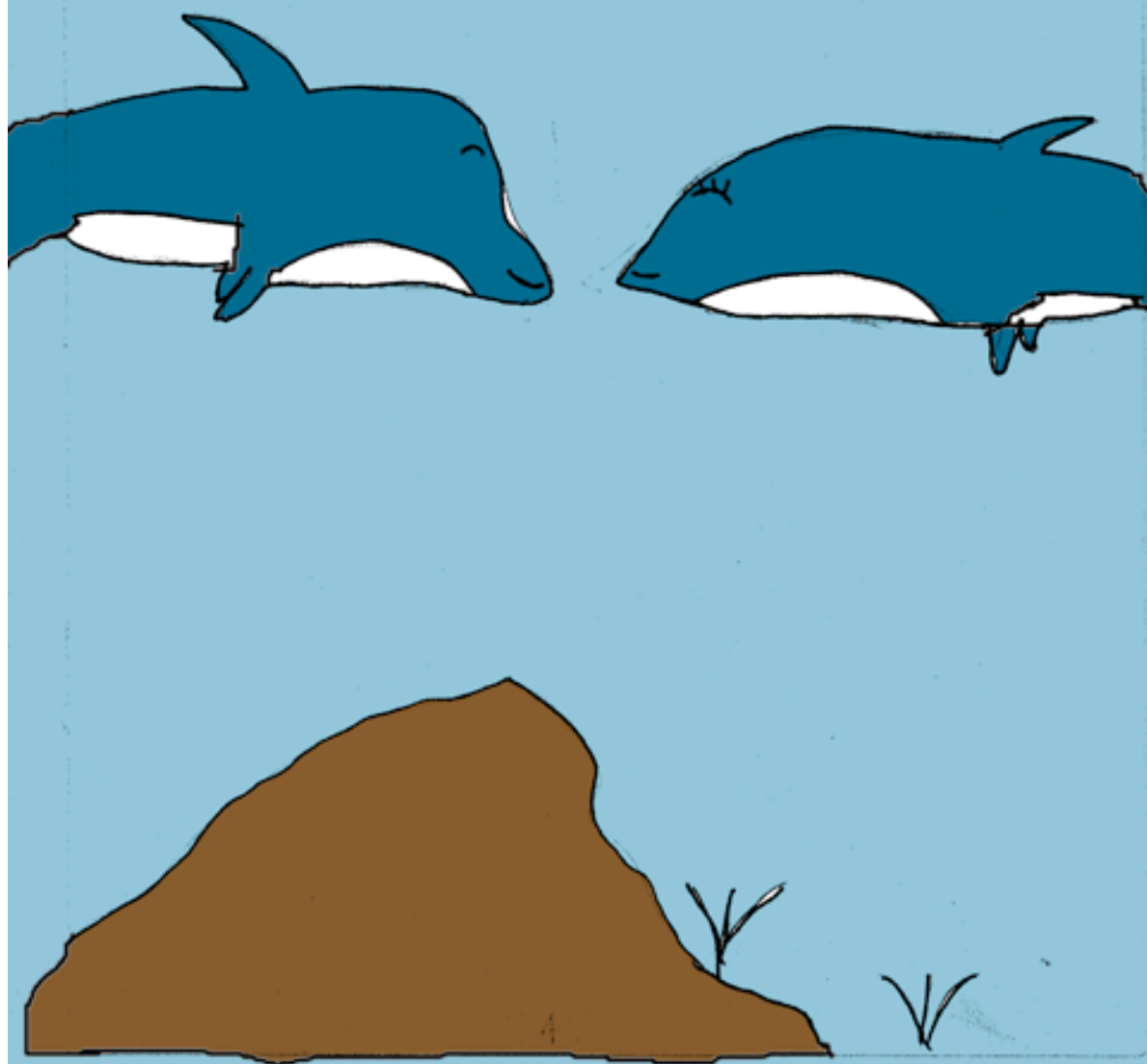
David's mom announced that all of them are going to the sea park and David's whole family cheered. They ate their breakfast of squid and off they went to the park.



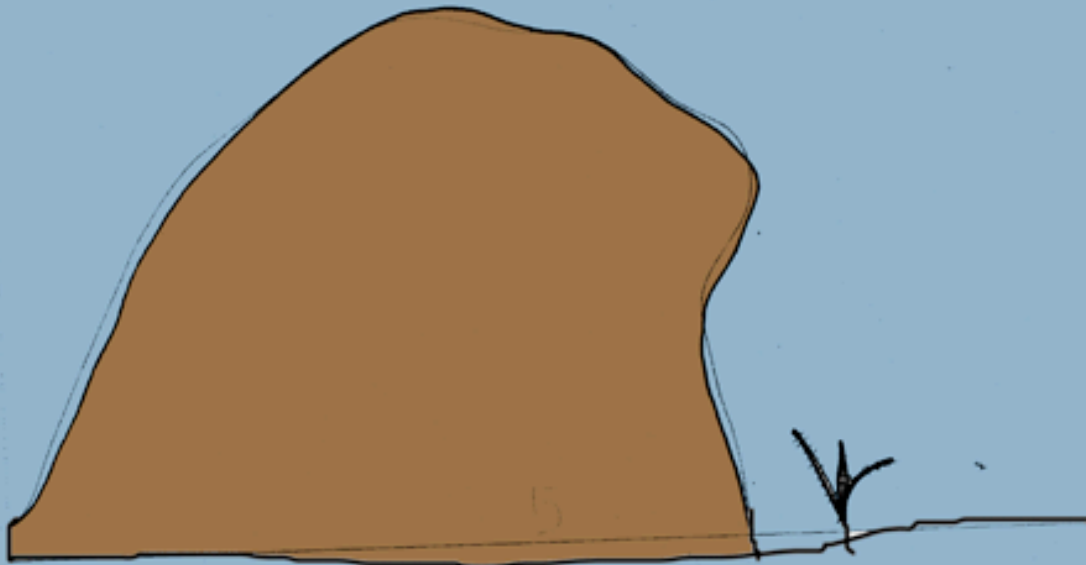
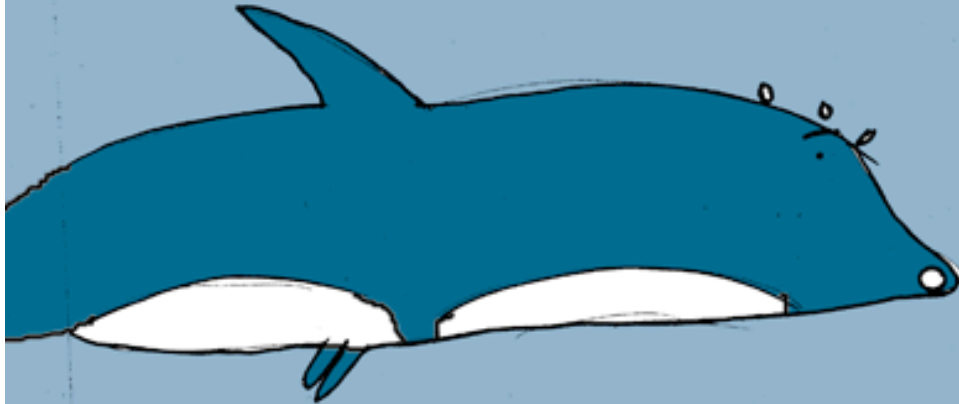

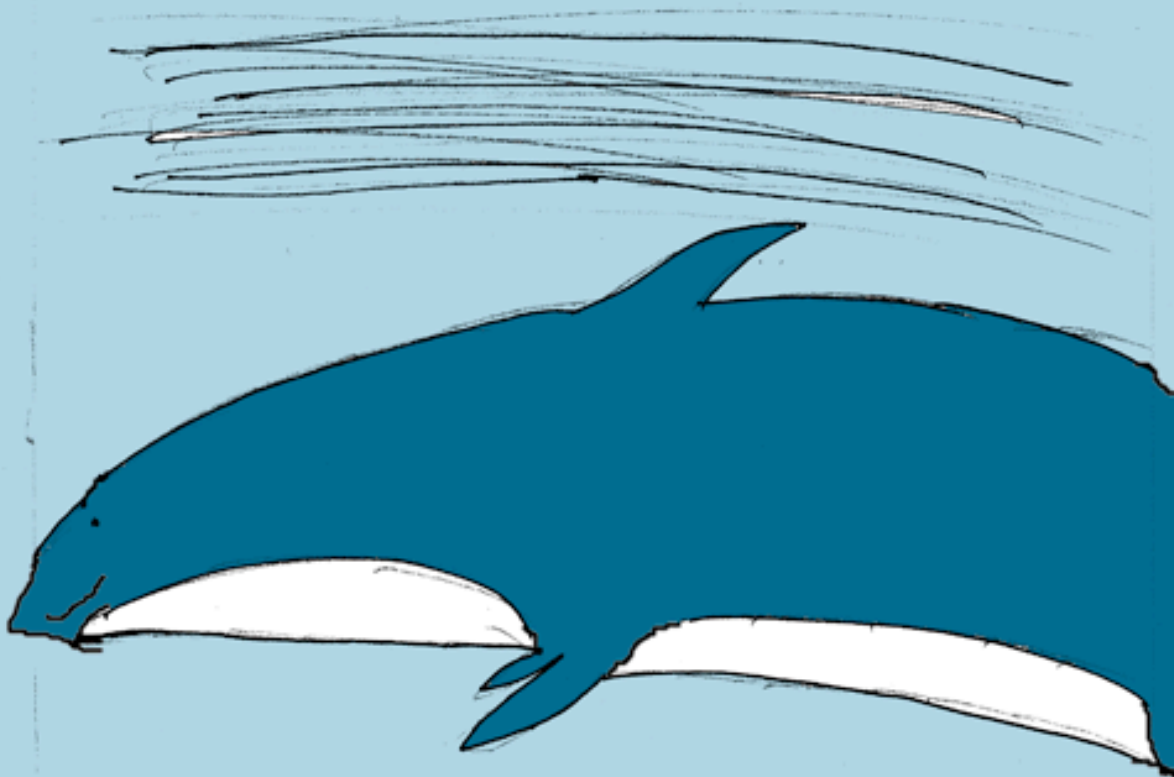
Moring came and Cassie hoped on David and off they went on their journey.
