Hi my name is Candace. My guest blog is about our state bird. Our state bird is the endangered nene goose. The nene goose is a grayish brown bird. The

nene has been our state bird since 1957!
That's over 50 years! On our island we can see Nene Crossing signs in the Volcano area. How's that?! We have signs specifically for nene goose crossing the streets. If you ever come to Hawaii please be careful of our beautiful state birds. In

1967 the nene goose was claimed as an endangered species under the Federal Endangered Species Act because of how low the population was. Our populations can be seen at Hawaii Volcanoes National Park, Mauna Loa, and Pu'u Wa'awa'a.
