Passed to its second reading and referred to a select Committee.

In Committee of the House the act to prevent married people deserting each other was taken up. Objections were taken to the present form of the bill and it was recommended to be recommitted.

The "Proper Names bill" of the Nobles, as redrafted by the House Committee, was then taken up and passed. It provides that all married women shall adopt their husbands' names as a family name.

All children born in lawful wedlock after date of this law shall take their father's name as a family name, also a Christian name suitable to their sex. Illegitimate children ditto mother's name.

All children up to twenty years of age shall adopt their father's name.

All names so adopted shall be reported to the census takers of the present year. It shall not be lawful to change any name adopted or conferred after passage of this law, or previous to it.

Father or mother of any child born after passage of this law shall report its name to the Registrar of births of the district. This law to take effect immediately.

Mr. Knudsen moved to add a section imposing a penalty of ten dollars for failure to comply with the provisions of the law. At present the law was without sanction. Mr. Widemann was opposed to the amendment. The law should not compel the people to abandon their old names if they didn't wish it. It set forth the bétter practice and should leave people to follow it. Messrs. Dowsett and McCully supported this view, and the amendment was lost.







MAHELE RECORDS ROYAL PATENTS BOUNDARY COMMISSION LAND GRANTS

Land Grants are sometimes confused with the Royal Patent Land Grants, especially after the word Royal was removed after the Overthrow, The earliest LG records (1846) are in both English and Hawajian.



Mahele Database The Mahele database includes the first legal documents written across the Hawaiian island chain (1848-1853) of 14,500 records. Awards given by the Land Commission gave legal title to land in fee ownership.



Ka Leo Hawai'i Radio Program, 1991-2000

In 1972 the radio program Ka Leo Hawai' (The Hawaiian Voice), was breadcast on KCCN-AM. It was onginally conceived as a 30-minute, brweekly program on Sundays, but due to popular demand it was soon extended to a weekly hour-bong formati. Ka Leo Hawai' was a general interest talk how consisting of interviews with native speakers. Larry Kimura, one of the program's founders, describes the show as an effort to "heip and support Hawaiain language students to get their ears used to hearing the Hawaiina language." Per Puakea Nogelmeier, radio time was purchased by private donations from 'Ahahui 'Olelo Hawaii (the Hawaiian Language Association) and Grace Pacific Corporation; the interviewers were volunteers.

Clinton Kanehele (1902-1979) spert his career as an educator in Hawaii. He served as principal of Castle High School in Kailua, Benjamin Parker Elementary School in Kaneohe, and Laie Elementary School in Laie. He served in the Oahu Stake Presidency under Edward Clissold for many years. Kanahele spoke fluent Hawaiian and was deeply committed to the preservation of the Hawaiian language. From June to September of 1970, Kanahele, with the assistance of William Sproaci, interviewed turventy individuals whose exceptional knowledge of Hawaiian language, history, and culture would prove valuable to future generations and help to "preserve the Hawaiian language." The subjects of the interviews range from Hawaiian culture, to the history of specific places such as Laie, Oahu, and Peahi, Maui, to the personal experiences of Native Hawaiians throughout their lives.

PIONEER MILL COMPANY HISTORY

James Campbell, who had been in the carpentry business in Lahaina for some ten years, started a sugar plantation there in 1860. The small mill was powered by mules and, together with cane from Campbell's fields, manufactured sugar on shares for small cane growers in the vicinity. One of these small growers was W.Y. Horner, who, around 1882, had a planting agreement with the new plantation for several years.

Soon after the establishment of the new plantation Henry Turton and James Dunbar joined Campbell. Under the name of Campbell & Turton, the company grew cane and manufactured sugar. In 1865, Dunbar had left the company and the plantation became known as Pioneer Mill Company. By 1874, Campbell and Turton had added the Lahaina Sugar Company and the West Maui Sugar Company, a venture of Kamehameha V, to the holdings of Pioneer Mill Company.

Somewhat more is known about the Strode House's builder. Riyoichi Kawasaki was born in Hiroshima, Japan in1892. At the time of the house's construction he was living at 912 Kaheka Lane in Honolulu.⁷ He was then 43 years old and lived as head of household with three daughters, a son, and a nephew.⁸ His name occurs frequently in newspaper notices. In 1931, he is listed as one of the leading customers of the Theo. H. Davies & Co.'s lumberyard.⁹ The same year *The Honolulu Advertiser* noted he completed two homes in Waikīkī.¹⁰ In 1932, he participated in a dinner held by the Honolulu Japanese Builders' Association (of which he was secretary and later auditor¹¹) to honor local architects.¹² In 1933, he is noted as one of the signers of the NRA agreement over laborers' hours and wages.¹³ An article of 1935 in the *Honolulu* 111 Dowsett Avenue / Albert B. & 1112 Mokulua Drive / Strode Resi 1112 Mokulua Drive / Strode Resi

Cottage A is part of a four house complex, comprised of a main house and cottages A. B. and C. Since 2003 the four houses have been in the possession of different owners, as at that time Richard Fujikawa's application was approved to convert tax map key (TMK) 2-4-017:031 into four units under a condominium property regime (CPR), and he sold the four units. Initially the four houses stood on two lots, TMK 2-4-017: 031 and TMK 2-4-017: 032. Parcel 31 contained 4.628 square feet and was originally purchased by Daniel J. Correa from General Corporation on February 10. 1935. Stella Lowrey purchased the 5,201 square foot parcel 32 from General Corporation on February 18, 1936. Ms. Lowrey died three months after her purchase, on May 24, 1936. Following the settling of Ms. Lowrey's affairs. Mr. Correa purchased parcel 32 on June 28, 1937. He constructed the main house on this parcel in approximately 1939. In December 1943 Mr. Correa sold both lots to Azel Christina Martin, who in turn sold the two properties to August M. and Emilia Rego in December 1944. 

The endorsement by Dr. Walters to the plaintiff Coney, is the ordinary special indorsement, "Pay to the order of J. H. Coney." But Coney admitted that this transfer was made without consideration passing and for collection merely. The plaintiff as indorsee became vested with the legal title and was the proper person to bring suit on the note. Even if it be proved that the transfer was for the purpose of collection merely suit thereon may be maintained by the holder. Authorities for these propositions of law are 2 Randolph, Commercial Paper, Secs. 735-6. Hawes, Parties to Actions, Sec. 35.

If Dr. Walters took this note for value without notice of the failure of consideration, then his indorsee, the present holder, may recover though he may be aware of the equities. 2 Greenleaf Ev., Sec. 171, 10th Ed.

We remark that the making of the note was shown to be admitted by defendant who offered to pay both to Dr. Walters and to the present holder one-half of it by way of compromise.

The exceptions are overruled.





The maps are made available here for ease of access through keyword place name searching. The descriptive metadata is minimal, compiled from various sources, and may contain errors. Much data is missing on the maps, especially dates, surveyors, even titles, and other cartographic details. Nevertheless, close examination of the maps with the large image viewer reveals rich historical information of Hawaii during the 1800s and early 1900s. Over time, we hope to gradually improve access and retrieval by refining the metadata for searching and discovery.




Maui News

Maui island's first newspaper, the Maui News, has been continuously published in Walluku, Maui in English since February 17, 1900. George B. Robertson edited the four-page, six-column weekly until 1905, when it was sold to The Maui Publishing Company, Ltd. Prominent Maui citzens Henry P. Baldwin, John Norman Spencer Williams, Carl Waldeyer, and Daniel Hebard Case formed the publishing company to purchase and run the paper. C.L. Clement (1905), Hugh M. Coke (1905-1910), and William J. Cooper (1914-1920) were among the

The collection includes files of more than sixty-four newspapers published in Hawai'i, in the English, Hawaiian, and Portuguese languages. The holdings date from 1834 to the 1930s and include original and microfilm copies. These newspapers carried shipping news, reports of volcanic eruptions, Hawaiian government reports, and Hawaiian genealogies and chants, as well as political, economic, and social news. Few of these newspapers are indexed.

Published and unpublished guides to the collection are available. Newspaper directories include: "Newspapers Published in Hawaii, Survey of the Holdings of the Hawaiian Historical Society," unpublished library guide, 1953; *Hawaii Newspapers and Periodicals on Microfilm, A Union List of Holdings in Libraries of Honolulu*, compiled by Hawaii State Archives, Hawaii Library Assn., 1977; *Hawaiian Newspapers*, by Esther K. Mookini, Topgallant Pub., 1974; *Hawaii Newspapers, A Union List*, prepared by Hawaii Newspaper Project, 1987. This list is a print-out of bibliographic records entered in OCLC.

In 2000, the Society published a complete reference to Hawai'i's newspapers up to that point: Helen G. Chapin, *Guide to Newspapers of Hawai'i*, *1834–2000*. An on-line version of Chapin's data is available at <u>http://www.hawaiianhistoricalsociety.org/ref/chapinmultisearch.php</u>.

Newspaper indexes include: Index to marriages and Index to birth notices published in Hawai'i's newspapers 1850–1950, and index to obituaries published in Hawai'i's newspapers, 1836–1950, on microfilm. Selected articles in *The Friend* are cataloged in the Hawaiian Mission Children's Society

Over the past year there have been numerous articles written about the abuses of JPAC and the DPMO concerning the recovery of our war dead. Financial waste and fraud seem to run rampant in both organizations. Those are our tax dollars they are wasting so we should be concerned. Two shining examples of their waste is the Tomb of the Vietnam Unknown (JPAC) and the DPMO Database (DPMO).

The Vietnam Unknown was created by CILHI (JPAC forerunner) by removing paperwork from the file of X-26 in Hawaii. If you have seen the Tomb at Arlington you just know it was expensive to build. The cost for the ceremonies, travel, etc. only added to the bill. Their willingness to boldly lie to the press was publicly on display. Fortunately not everyone working for CILHI was underhanded and the truth did eventually come out. The Unknown was disinterred from Arlington, identified and sent back to his family. Leaving the American taxpayers with an empty tomb which will probably never be used. (There is more information about this case and others like it on the JPAC FOLLIES page of this website.)

As for the DPMO database, a little background is in order. In the November 2003, issue #122 of After the Battle magazine the article "Finding Americas Missing" appeared. (Full article is on the Article page of this web site.) It told the story of the databases that had been completed by this Group and how we were using it to find MIA's from the World War II period. Wasn't long until we were contacted by a Lt. Colonel from that office asking for an example of the database and a cost for the MIA section. It had cost \$40,000.00 to build and that is what we offered it to them for. Everything seemed agreeable until it got into the hands of the civilians at that office. There it was decided that they would form the "WW2 Working Group" under the supervision of Dr. Mansavage, PhD and build their own database from the ground up using just some of the primary source documentation we had used to build ours! How much did it cost to build their own? I really don't know but it took them four years to complete. So now, ten years later, we have decided to do a side by side comparison of the two databases and let the reader decide.

The mission of the Defense POW/Missing Personnel Office (DPMO) is to exercise policy, control, and oversight within DoD for the entire process for investigation and recovery related to missing persons; coordinate for DoD with other departments and agencies of the United States on all matters concerning missing persons; and establish procedures to be followed by DoD boards of inquiry. DPMO sends redacted documents to FRD for indexing and microfilming.

In March 1992, the U.S. - Russia Joint Commission on POWs and MIAs (USRJC) was established by direction of the Presidents of the United States and the Russian Federation to serve as a forum through which both nations seek to determine the fate of their missing servicemen. DPMO provides direct analytical, investigative, and administrative support to the USJRC through the Joint Commission Support Directorate. The Commission's objectives are to determine whether American servicemen are being held against their will on the territory of the former Soviet Union and, if so, to secure their immediate release and repatriation; to locate and return to the United States the remains of any deceased American servicemen interred in the former Soviet Union; and to ascertain the facts regarding American servicemen who were not repatriated and whose fate remains unresolved.


