MELE NOTES

Kahālāwai - Mauna Kahālāwai, West Maui Mountains

Nānāhoa - A name of the 'Īao Needle. Also known as Kūka'emoku.

Kinihāpai - The area behind the 'lao needle; also the name of the stream that comes from the Kinihāpai area and flows past the base of the 'lao Needle
