

# KALAMAKŪALI'Ī CHALLENGE

## What is a principle?

*n. An adopted rule or method for application in action; fundamental or core belief that influences one's actions. (dictionary.com)*

**Principles guide the learning, teaching and overall development of our Kula Hawai'i high school to ensure that we see our work (students, staff, faculty) as authentic, significant, and worthwhile.**

**Goal** The goal is to develop principles that guide learning for our Kula Hawai'i high school. These principles will be used as criteria to support the overall high school program.

**Role** You are a group of mixed staff members tasked with developing the proposal.

**Audience** Trustees and executive leadership

**Situation** You have been tasked to develop a presentation highlighting the principles for the Kula Hawai'i high school based upon the "21<sup>st</sup> Century Skills and Attributes for Hawaiians" document (created by KHS faculty & staff in 2008) as well as foundational school documents provided on the LiveBinder. The presentation should also address descriptions of what each principle looks like in practice and how these principles are reflected in student learning (How is the learning different from what we generally do? If there is no difference, briefly explain.)

## **Product/Performance**

Performance: 3-5 minutes to faux Trustees in your room

Product: presentation (ie ppt, keynote, prezi, podcast, --be CREATIVE)

**Criteria for Success** Presentation should include:

- 5-7 learning principles linked to the Kula Hawai'i high school foundational documents on LiveBinder (make sure you identify and reference the sources to each principle)
- Descriptions of what these principles "look like" in practice (i.e. how would students learn in this environment?)
  - Principles should reflect learning within our Kula Hawai'i high school as our piko (foundation) and to be applicable to all students and our program.
- An explanation of how each principle is different from what we generally do? Or if not different, briefly explain why should be maintained.
- No more than 10 slides and/or 5 minutes. 1 slide per principle. Include min 2 visuals.
- Other resources and sources, if used, should be referenced
