Learning Simulations: Dyslexia (Midkiff LVA Ma uka)

Presenter: The International Dyslexia Association, Hawai'i Branch (HIDA)

This presentation will include a brief overview of dyslexia, how reading disabilities affect learning, and how appropriate teaching and intervention can help dyslexic children and other struggling readers. Workshop attendees will rotate through learning stations which simulate various language-related tasks similar to those encountered in the classroom and workplace. This will be followed by an explanation and discussion of the aspects of dyslexia being simulated, how they impact everyday life skills inside and outside of the classroom, and some suggestions for teaching dyslexic learners.

Integrating the Working Exit Outcomes (WEO) and Kula Hawai'i Statement, the workshops are: 'Ōlelo Hawai'i for the Classroom, Mālama Honua Worldwide Voyage, Ku'i 'Ai, and Hana I Ke Kaula Hau. These are introductory level workshops and no prior experience or background is required.

'Ōlelo Hawai'i for the Classroom*

Designed especially for kumu (teachers) and others in the school setting. Enjoy learning:

- *Kamehameha Schools baseline 'ōlelo Hawai'i words and phrases*

- Hands-on learning of how to cook and clean kalo
- Different meanings of the expression Aloha 'Āina

Kūpuna knew and practiced important concepts such as sustainability and environmental stewardship in our islands for millennia. Making cordage was an important practice that provided an essential product for everyday life and survival. Engage in and learn the:

- Making of a two-ply twist cordage of hau fiber
- Process of creating cordage from hau
- Importance of hau in Hawaiian culture
- Innovation and adaptation in traditional practices
