Learning Goal

Keiki will learn about where the food we eat comes from, about farm animals, and about a farmer's job. Keiki will also extend their learning by drawing a picture of an animal and doing a little research about it.

Extension Activity

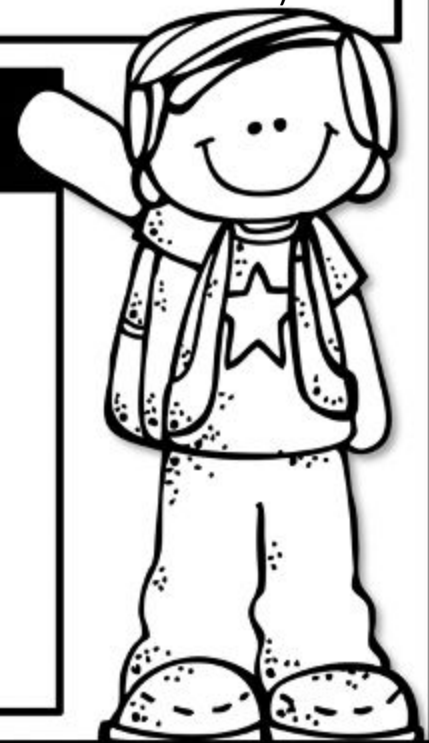

Language

Make up a story about the animal you chose to draw and research. Tell it to your mom or dad and have them write it down for you.

Ex. This is Dilly Duck. He went to swim in the pond and dove for fish to eat for lunch. It started to rain on his way home from the pond but Dilly didn't mind. He splashed through the puddles and had so much fun. The End.

Math

If there was a horse, a cow, and a chicken in the field, how many legs would there be all together?

If there was a goat on one side of the barn, how many chickens would you need on the other side to have an equal amount of legs on each side of the barn?

Draw pictures to help you solve the problems. ;o)

Science

Farm animals provide lots of things but especially food for us. Can you figure out which foods come from which animals?
