Personal Systematic Theology

Senior Course Syllabus

Description:

In this course, the seniors will reflect upon the core beliefs of Christianity and develop their own understanding of these beliefs. They will be guided by various readings from the Bible and other literature, group discussions and personal reflection. The material presented is from the Protestant perspective, though the students are encouraged to understand these topics from their own religious viewpoint.

By the end of the course, the student shall be able to share, in a clear and concise manner, his/her basic understanding of creation, God, Jesus, the Holy Spirit, sin, and other related topics.

5	Sin enters the world	Review Genesis 2. What is sin?		
6	Jesus	What did Jesus claim about himself? Who is Jesus to you- Lord, Liar or Lunatic?		

7	Salvation- Redemption	What does Christ's redemption mean to you? Find two verses. What do they mean to you?
8	Work of the Holy Spirit	What is the Holy Spirit to you?
9	Spiritual Gifts	What gift(s) do you have and how would you use it/them to serve others?
10	Ecclesiology (the Church)	How does/would your church serve as a sign, foretaste and instrument of God's kingdom?
11	Devotion 1	Look at a devotional format. Write a devotional. Focus on "Hook" and "Took"
12	Devotion 2	Continue writing a devotional. Focus on "Book" and "Took" Assignment is due April 17.
13	Mauna Ala	History of Mauna 'Ala and program for Maui and Hawai'l campuses visit on May 24.
