

## Kamehameha Middle School Kapālama Picnic Expectations

One of the most anticipated days of the school year is the annual class picnic. As a reminder, this is a normal school day and all school rules apply. You are expected to carry yourself with "dignity and pride" by practicing pono behavior. Read and understand the following expectations.

DATE: Grade 7 – Friday, April 4, 2014 PLACE: Waimānalo Beach Park

**BUS ASSIGNMENT:** You will ride the same bus going to the picnic and returning to campus. A head count will be taken both ways. When you return to campus, report to your assigned club/study group. All students will return to campus via school transportation.

**BUS ETIQUETTE:** Students are to review the Bus Passenger Code on pages 54 and 55 in the <u>Student & Parent Handbook</u>. Any vandalism to seats, windows, etc. will be paid for by the offender.

**PONO BEHAVIOR:** Your actions may have a serious effect on someone else and determine future KMS beach outings. Be respectful of the environment and each other. Mālama each other and the area(s) you use during the day. Posting of pictures without prior consent of the individual is not permitted.

## ACCEPTABLE ITEMS: Please be aware that bags may be checked.

- Please bring your own snacks. This includes beverages. No coolers.
- You are responsible for your personal belongings. Leave valuables at home. If you don't need it, don't bring it.
- Electronic devices for music purposes are permitted, but are the sole responsibility of the individual.
- NO surfboards, snorkels, skateboards or wave riders. Only boogie boards are acceptable.
- Sunscreen is encouraged.

**PROHIBITED ITEMS:** Alcoholic beverages, cigarettes, pillows, toys (including balloons, water pistols, and water guns), spray paint, shaving cream, dyes, drugs, flammable materials or other dangerous items.

APPROPRIATE ATTIRE - Consequences will be issued to students who are disrespectfully and inappropriately dressed at any time, or do not follow these guidelines. You are encouraged to bring an extra set of clothes in case your attire is deemed inappropriate by an adult. When in doubt, check with a kumu prior to the picnic.

## Appropriate Attire Transporting Self To and From the Beach

- Straps on sleeveless blouses must be at least 2 inches in width.
- No mid-driff or see through (sheer) top/blouse.
- Shorts length to be no higher than the measure from *relaxed shoulder, middle fingertip length.*
- No beach shorts that hang down at the waist.
- No enlarged arm hole on tank tops.
- T-shirts with printed logos or advertisements should be tasteful and reflect self-respect and respect for others. No profanity.
- Sunglasses, hats, and slippers are permitted.
- Capris, KS PE shorts and jeans (not tattered or torn) are acceptable.
- No yoga pants, leggings or jeggings.
- You should be changed and dried before boarding the bus. Please do not track sand onto the bus.
- You may report to club/study hall upon arrival to campus in your appropriate attire listed above.

## Appropriate Beach Attire

- **Girls:** One piece bathing suit.
- Boys: Board shorts worn at the waist. No Speedos or Jammers.

Please keep in mind that we can all have FUN while being aware that our actions express who we are and also determine the continuation of these kinds of school sponsored outings.
