This is the Fourth Annual “KMS Make A Difference Day”. The service that you will provide will benefit many in the Kalihi Community.

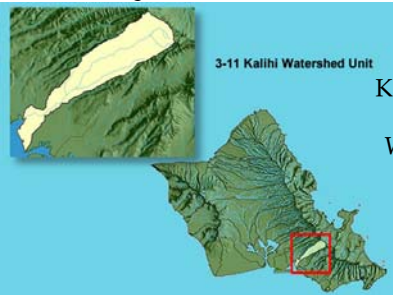
Benefits of Service—Student and ‘Ohana Comments

What Can I Do to Make A Difference on November 14, 2009



Overview of Service Projects

- 1. Kalihi Stream**—Help clean the banks of the Kalihi Stream clean. NO ONE WILL BE ALLOWED TO ENTER THE STREAM! Last year over a ton of green waste was removed from the banks of the stream, including a kitchen sink!
- 2. Graffiti Removal**—Help paint over ugly graffiti on the walls of the merchants near the Kalihi Stream and upon City Bus Stops in the area.
- 3. KAUPA**—(*Kalihi Ahupua‘a Ulu Pono Ahahui*) – Is a non-profit organization located in the Kalihi area. The mission of KAUPA is to restore the natural and cultural resources within our ahupua‘a through education, outreach and action.
- 5. Nalanieha**—KMS has “adopted” the Nalanieha site in Kalihi Valley. Let’s mālama i ka ‘āina at Nalanieha.
- 6. Storm Drain Stenciling**—Water that flows into the storm drains is not treated. Pollutants and debris flow into the storm drain and then into our water shed. Help to curb illegal dumping into the storm drain by stenciling a reminder.
- 7. Lo‘i Kalo Park**—Reconnect with the ‘āina by helping to maintain this natural resource located in the heart of Kalihi.
- 8. Ke‘ehi Lagoon Park**—Is the end of the Kalihi Watershed. All the ‘ōpala from the streams empties here and enters the ocean. Help to clean the area.

Who Can Help Make A Difference?

Any student or parent may participate in the day’s activities.

What Forms Must I Complete to Make A Difference?

Students unaccompanied by parent or guardian must complete:

1. KS Permission to Participate (Exhibit A)
2. KS Permission to Initiate Medical Care & Release (Exhibit F)
3. C&C PSA Authorization

Parents or Guardian must be:

1. Cleared KS Volunteer, and complete
2. C&C PSA Authorization
