Dear Students and Parents/Guardians:

Summertime is almost here, and that means another season for the **Kamehameha Summer Reading Program**. Summer is an excellent time for reading and provides countless opportunities: reading at the beach, reading on the lānai, reading on the plane, reading on the bus, reading by the pool. The possibilities are endless.

Research shows a strong connection between independent reading and increased vocabulary and comprehension skills. In an effort to promote year-round independent reading outside of the classroom, English and language arts teachers have established a summer reading program for grades 1 through 12.

At the start of school in the fall, students entering grade 8 will be expected to have read a minimum of **two** books over the summer. The **required** 8th grade summer reading book is ***The Crossover*** by Kwame Alexander. We are pleased to announce that a copy of this novel will be given to each seventh grade student in his or her English class before the end of the school year. This book will be used by all four 8th grade teams at the beginning of the next school year. For their second selection, students may pick **any novel of choice** with at least 150 pages. Within the first month of the new school year, English teachers will assess the students' knowledge of the two titles they read.

Young people often look to parents and other significant adults for guidance and inspiration. We urge parents to share in this summer's reading; by reading and discussing with your child, you can both share the enjoyment reading can bring. Your consistent support and encouragement play an important role in your child's ongoing growth and development. 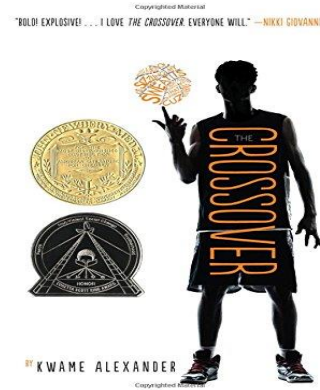
