



Comma (numbers) [1], Parentheses [2], Hyphen (single-thought adjectives) [3], Verb (tense) [1]

Light moved at such an out of this world rate 186000 miles per second that it doesn't seem to move at all.

Rules:

Hyphen – joins two or more words to form a single-thought adjective before a noun

Examples: <u>heat-and-serve</u> meals; <u>microwave-safe</u> cookware

Verb tenses:

Present: I write. She hides.

Past: Earlier I wrote. Earlier she hid.

Past Participle: I have written. She has hidden.
