## HOW YOU CAN HELP AT OUR COUNTRY STORE

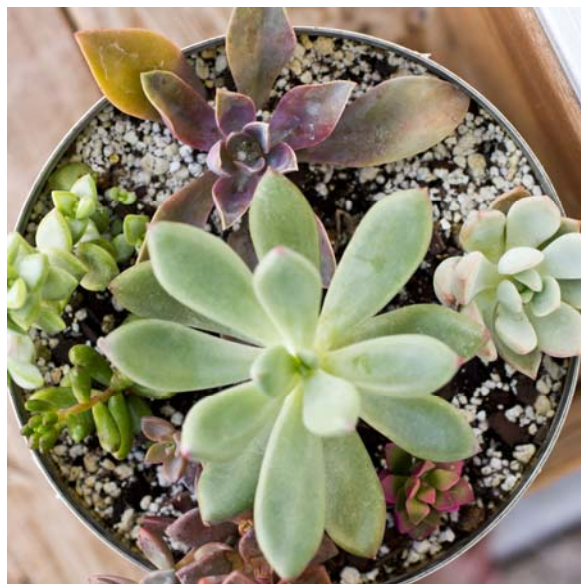
