Aloha e nā haumana a me nā 'ohana, and welcome to a new semester—ke ola hou—a fresh start! I am thrilled to be serving you!

Without question, I will have much to learn this year as we continue transitioning into a Mac/Apple platform. While periodic 'extra-credit' opportunities may arise, please keep in mind that, in this class, extracredit is exactly that: *extra--in addition to*. This means that all required assignments and obligations have first been met. (Our extra-credit assignments are NOT substituted assignments for work that has been neglected. Students must first accomplish the required work and meet certain performance standards *before* being eligible for any 'extra-credit.') Please do not request extra-credit or extra-work until all required assignments have been successfully completed.

I am optimistic about our future together and am looking forward to developing professional and productive relationships with all of you. Please know that I want nothing more than for all of us to succeed, and that I am available before, during and after school for additional consultation, clarification and assistance if any of us needs it.
