The following information is taken from the TSA website (<http://www.tsa.gov/travelers>):

Effective June 21, 2008, adult passengers (18 and over) are required to show a U.S. federal or state-issued photo ID that contains the following: name, date of birth, gender, expiration date and a tamper-resistant feature in order to be allowed to go through the checkpoint and onto their flight.

Hawaiian Airlines and Island Air require us to provide the name of each student as it appears on their school identification, gender and date of birth when reservations are made by the Boarding Department for common weekend and vacation travel. Your child will be able to use their Kamehameha ID card as the identification required to check in because of their student status. The name on their Kamehameha ID card is determined by the information received through the Kamehameha Admissions Office.

There may be a handful of students who will be 18 before the school year is over. If this situation describes your child, please make arrangements for your child to get an acceptable ID as defined on the TSA website (<http://www.tsa.gov/travelers>):

Passengers who do not or cannot present an acceptable ID will have to provide information to the Transportation Security Officer performing Travel Document Checking duties in order to verify their identity. Passengers who are cleared through this process may be subject to additional screening. Passengers whose identity cannot be verified by TSA may not be allowed to go through the checkpoint or onto an airplane.

The information required for the purpose of booking flights for common weekends and vacation periods is on the Travel Agreement form. Students without a permission form cannot be accommodated with group travel.
