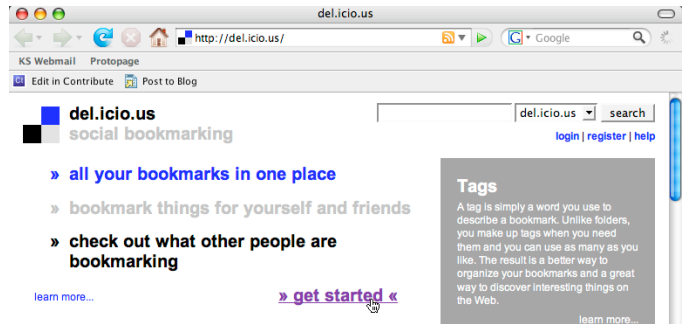




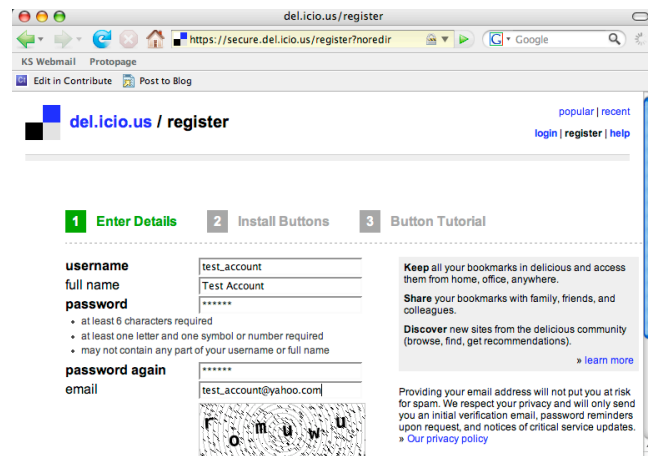
Go to the del.icio.us website at <http://del.icio.us/> and click on the 'get started' link



Create a username and password. Your username will become part of the url to log you into your del.icio.us account.

Example: username = test\_account

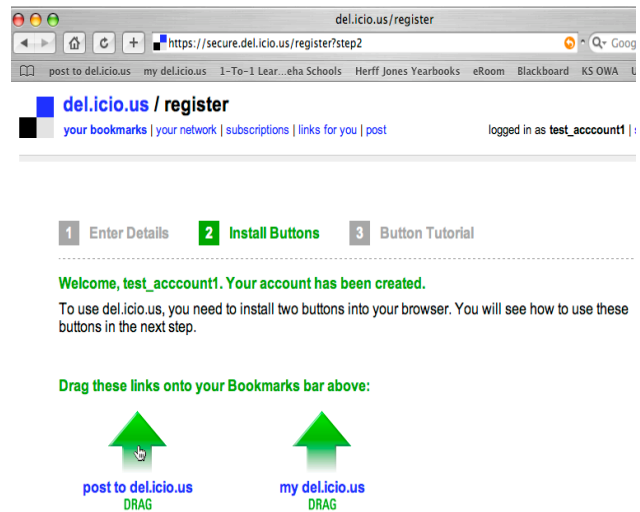
Del.iciou.us url = [http://del.icio.us/test\\_account](http://del.icio.us/test_account)



Install the del.icio.us links by clicking and dragging the 2 links:

'post to del.icio.us'  
and  
'my del.icio.us'

to your bookmarks bar.



When you are done, click on 'Proceed to Step 3'.



**“Post to del.icio.us” button**  
**Save your current page to del.icio.us**

As you browse the web and find a page you want to save, click this button. You can add a description, notes, and tags to the page before saving it.

**View your saved pages**

**Add bookmarks**

When you're visiting a page that you'd like to save to del.icio.us, click the button at the top of your browser labeled 'post to del.icio.us'.



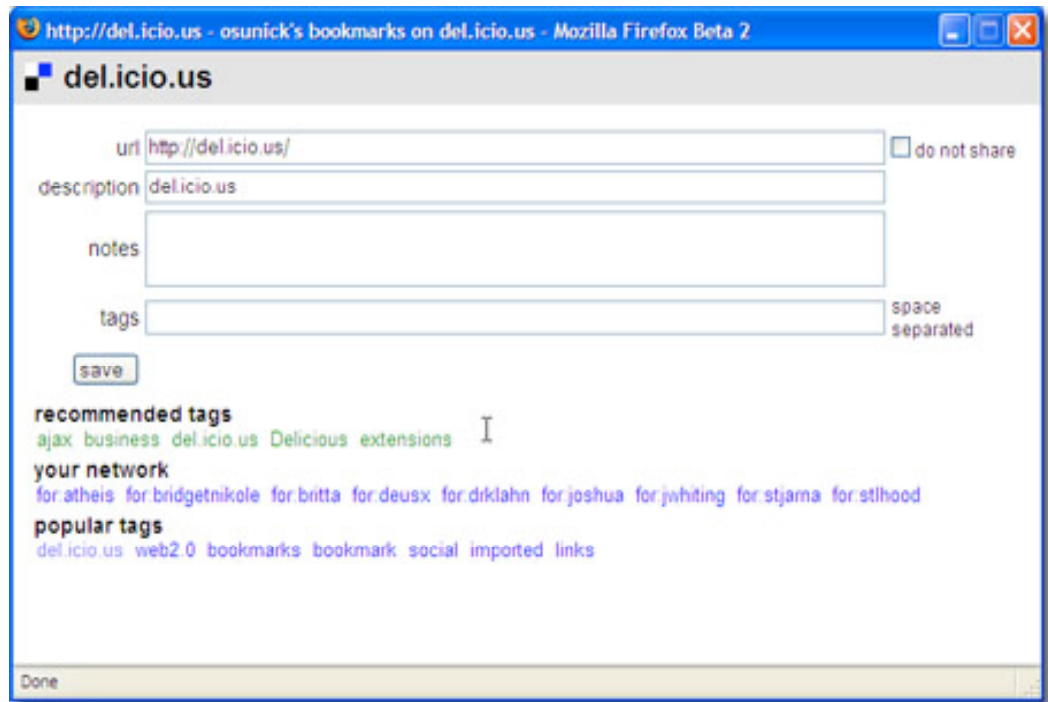
Then, fill out the information in the posting interface and save it -- you've just saved a bookmark to del.icio.us!

The **url** is the web address of the bookmark that you're saving. This usually starts with `http://`, and is necessary to save anything in del.icio.us.

The **description** is the name of the bookmark that you are saving. It is automatically set to the title of the page, if available. You can change this if you'd like.

**Notes** are a way to include extended text of what the bookmark is about. This can be text copied from the document or anything that you want to include along with the bookmark.

**Tags** are words that you assign to the bookmark to help you (and other people) find it later.

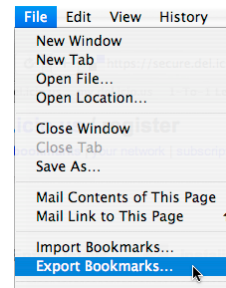


To see your saved bookmarks, click on 'my del.icio.us' located on your bookmarks bar. A bookmark saved by you looks like this:



### Import bookmarks

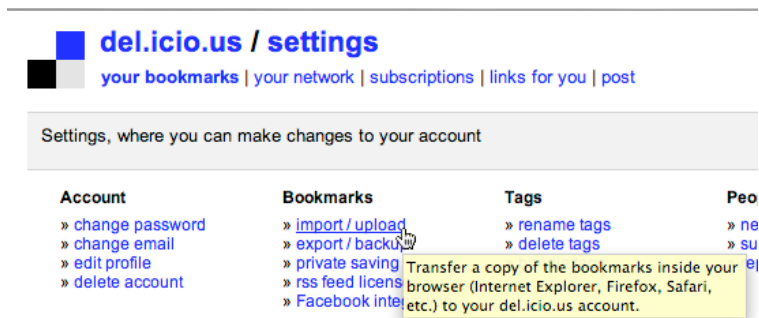
If you have bookmarks or favorites in your browser that you'd like to upload to del.icio.us, you can use import/upload in your settings to add them to your account. You can upload as many bookmarks files as you like, one at a time. This can be convenient for consolidating bookmarks from multiple computers.



First you need to export your bookmarks to a bookmark file. In Safari, go to File---Export Bookmarks.

Select where you want to save this file.

Now go to the settings page in del.icio.us. Under 'Bookmarks' click on 'import/upload'. This will allow you to choose the bookmark file you previously saved.



All bookmarks will be imported to your del.icio.us site. You can go back and edit these bookmarks as described below.

### Edit and delete bookmarks

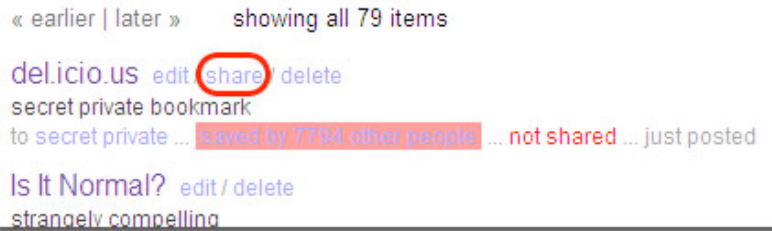
After saving an item, you can edit its description, notes, and tags by going to your bookmarks and visiting the "edit" link next to that bookmark's description. Similarly, if you'd like to delete a item, visit the "delete" link next to its description.



## Private and public bookmarks

Bookmarks saved with your buttons are public by default, but imported bookmarks are private by default. If you see "not shared" next to a bookmark, that means it is a private bookmark and only you can see it.

*Note: if you're logged out, you won't be able to see your private bookmarks either.*



To change a private bookmark to public (so that everyone else can see it), click the "share" link next to it.

To change a public bookmark to private, first enable private saving in your settings. Then edit your bookmark, check the do not share box, and save it. While saving a new bookmark, you can also check the do not share box to make that bookmark private.

## Sharing and exploring

To show your friends your bookmarks, you can give them a link to your del.icio.us site.

Want to see what other people are bookmarking? You can start with the del.icio.us home page, which includes the hotlist (the most popular links of the moment) and tags to watch, which include other popular links organized by tag.
